Personal, Social,	Over the Easter holidays the 'Vaisakhi' festival took place, the children will be learning about this celebration
Emotional Development	and appreciate other cultures including engaging in a role play, dancing and dressing up. We will be
(PSE)	developing a sense of responsibility for our own individual cultures.
Physical Development	In the environment there will be a nature tray with a variety of flowers and leaves which the children will use
(PD)	scissors to cut up and explore the different parts of a flower and develop their scientific knowledge. We will
	introduce the children to key vocabulary such as stem, roots, and petal.
Communication &	During circle time the children will be developing their knowledge on spring and new beginnings. We will
Language (CL)	think about the animals who will be waking up from hibernation similar to the bear in our story.
Literacy (LD)	The next two weeks the children will independently be supported to observe and draw flowers/plants. We
	will continue to develop our understanding of different parts of the flower and check how our plants are
	growing in Team Nursery. Our letters and sounds activity for this half term will be focusing on rhyme.
Mathematical	The children will be able to participate in a game in which we use a dice to roll and count the number of
Development (MD)	spots. The children will be encouraged to collect the correct number of items to represent that number. The
	children will be developing their subitizing skill in which they can recognise an amount by looking rather than
	counting.
Understanding the	Over the next two weeks and beyond, the children will be going on a signs of spring walk and observing the
World (UW)	different things we can spot that represent spring time. We will also look at the life cycle of a frog and
	understand the different parts of a life cycle.
Expressive Arts & Design	Finally, to continue with Vaisakhi, the children will be able to dance and move to a range of music and use
(EAD)	ribbons and scarves to support their dancing to celebrate the festival. The children will be encouraged to
	use musical instruments to represent their feelings and emotions and if they wish perform their songs to
	their friends.
Nursery Home Challenge	Your home challenge is to participate in your own signs of spring walk whilst you are away from nursery. You
	can record your findings on tapestry or in your home nursey liaison book. This will help support and develop
	the children's understanding which in turn can help develop their friend's knowledge.
